Honey: Food with a History and Hidden Benefits

Dear Friends and Family in Christ,

A while ago one of my devotionals concentrated on honey. May is a month of Mother's Day and other sweet occasions. I would like to discuss Honey.



According to the devotional, when the tomb of Egyptian King Tutankhamen was discovered in 1922, it was filled with things ancient Egyptians thought were needed in the afterlife. Among items, such as golden shrines, jewelry, clothing, furniture, and weapons, was a pot filled with honey, still edible after 3,200 years.



Today we think of honey primarily as a sweetener, but in the ancient world it had many other uses. Honey is considered to be a food known to have all the nutrients needed to sustain life, so it was eaten for nutrition. Honey is known to improve digestion. It can help to keep your digestive tract working properly due to its antimicrobial properties. I found that it has

many other properties and therapeutic benefits, after looking it up on the Internet.

Honey also contains glucose oxidase, an enzyme that is beneficial for alleviating gastritis. It increases energy by reducing muscle fatigue. Glucose is absorbed instantly while the fructose in it is absorbed over time, which gives acute and sustained energy. Honey is sweet but will not cause a spike in your blood glucose due to having a low glycemic index.

My mother used to give me and my siblings hot tea with lemon and honey when we had a cough or sore throat. That is a use today because of a natural cough suppressant property, as well as potent antibacterial. It can also be used topically for minor cuts etc. due to antibacterial, antimicrobial and antiseptic properties. It also looks to reduce pain, lessen pus and odor and helps to promote a faster recovery and lessen a chance of scarring. It also helps heal minor burns as it has both antifungal and antibacterial effects. Honey can be put directly on a burn. It is also known for helping to improve facial skin by preventing pimples and will alleviate dryness and inflammation of skin conditions like eczema and psoriasis.

When God rescued the children of Israel from Egyptian captivity, He promised to lead them to a "land flowing with milk and honey" (Ex 3:8,17) a metaphor for abundance. When their journey was prolonged due to sin, God fed them bread (manna) that tasted like honey. The Israelites grumbled about having to eat the same food for so long, but it's likely that God was kindly reminding them of what they would enjoy in the Promised Land.

God still uses honey to remind us that His ways and words are sweeter than the honeycomb (Ps 19:10). So then the words we speak should also be like the honey we eat, both sweet and healing. "Gracious words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones" Proverbs 16:24.

Walking in Faith

In What Are You Afraid Of? Facing Down Your Fears With Faith (Tyndale House), David Jeremiah describes Englishman John Pounds (1755-1839) as an example of facing debilitation with faith. While working at the docks as a teen, Pounds fell from a ship's mast. Recovery took two years. Out of boredom while bedridden, he began reading the Bible and soon accepted Christ.

Once well enough, Pounds worked for a cobbler and later bought his own shop, making orthopedic shoes for disabled children. His own body had healed crookedly, resulting in constant pain, so he could identify with the people he served. Pounds also fed homeless children, taught them to read and told them about Jesus.

"What might John Pounds have become had he not been severely injured?" Jeremiah asks. Our struggles often enable us to empathize with and help people we wouldn't have met otherwise. Through our weakness, God can minister to others (2 Corinthians 12:9).
